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1. **ANNOUNCEMENT**
The Queensland Early Motorcycle Sports Club Incorporated, hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct the QEMSC Interclub Race Meeting at Carnell Raceway, Stanthorpe, Qld on Saturday and Sunday **25th & 26th of July 2015**. For classes of competition please see section 6 below.
2. **JURISDICTION**
 - 2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Queensland who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number **42102** and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Senior & Senior National One Meeting Licences. **One meeting** licences will be sold on the day. **All participants must be full financial members of QEMSC, Motorcycle Sportsmen, North Coast Road Racers or the Road Racing Association of Townsville.**
 - 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport General Competition Rules (GCRs), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by Motorcycling Queensland.
BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.
3. **ENTRIES**
 - 3.1 Entries open forthwith and close on **Sunday 12th July 2015**.
 - 3.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the promoter, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling Queensland.
 - 3.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
 - 3.4 **RETURN OF ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING WILL BE CONSIDERED ONLY IF NOTIFICATION IS GIVEN AT LEAST ONE WEEK PRIOR TO THE RACE DAY.**
 - 3.5 **ENTRY LISTS WILL BE LOADED ON OUR WEB SITE STARTING APPROX 4 WEEKS FROM RACE DAY**
 - 3.5 **ALL ENTRIES TO BE POSTED TO: Rex Dell, PO Box 3188, Southport MC, Q. 4215**
4. **ENTRY FEE**
 - 4.1 An entry fee of **\$140.00** will be charged for all senior solo and sidecar competitors. **Each entrant can compete in a maximum of 2 classes.** Second machine entry please add \$20 for an extra timing transponder. No charge for spare machines in the same class as you must use your original transponder & advise the Clerk of the Course. Spare machines cannot be crossed entered by another rider. **One meeting licences will be available on the day at a cost of \$55.00.** Full payment MUST accompany the entry form.
LATE ENTRIES MAY BE ACCEPTED SUBJECT TO A LATE PAYMENT FEE OF \$50.
 - 4.2 Payment by cheque, money order or EFT. **ANY FEES FOR DISHONOURD CHEQUES WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT. DO NOT SEND CASH THROUGH THE MAIL.** Cheques and money orders are to be made payable to QEMSC. For those wishing to pay by EFT please make the payment to QEMSC, Bank of QLD, BSB; 124001 Account number; 10419361. Please insert your name as the reference, print the transfer confirmation & post with your completed & signed entry form.

5. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

Classes of competition will be finalized approx 2 weeks before the event and are dependent on entries received for that class. Any decision to run a class, or to combine classes, will be at the discretion of the promoter, subject to the approval of the **RACE STEWARD**.

6. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

Class 1 # Historic sidecars – Period 3/4/5

Class 2 # Historic Period 2 – Pre 1946 solos up to 1300cc (will race with Period 3)

Class 3 # Historic Period 3 – Pre 1963 solos up to 1300cc

Class 4 # Historic Period 4 – 1963 to 1972 solos, up to all 500cc and 650 cc 4 stroke twins

Class 5 # Historic Period 5 – 1973 to 1982 solos, any capacity single cylinder, up 350cc two stroke, 4 stroke 650cc twins & 3 or 4 cylinder 4 stroke to 500cc

Class 6 # Historic Period 6 -- 1983 to 1990 (as per Period 5)

NOTE - All historic entries must have a current log book

Class 7 # Modern Sidecars – Formula 1&2

Class 8 # Superlites & Stockers (as per GCR's & NCRR specifications)

Class 9 # Motolites (as per GCR's & NCRR specifications)

Class 10 # Supermotards (as per 2015 MOMS) (Minimum of 12 entries required to run this class)

Class 11 # Regularity (non competition) (see details on page 4 of this document)

Note: Superlites & Stockers will most likely all run with Period 5

Note: Motolites will most likely run with Period 6

7. INSURANCE

7.1 MA's National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability only.

7.2 **IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.**

7.3 **ALTHOUGH ALL QLD RESIDENTS HAVE AUTOMATIC AMBULANCE COVER IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT INTERSTATE COMPETITORS TAKE OUT AMBULANCE COVER IN THEIR OWN STATE.**

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

An ambulance will be in attendance between 11am–5pm on Saturday and 10am–4pm Sunday.

9. **AWARDS: Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd for solo classes with at least 6 entries & sidecars with 4. First & second for less than 6 & first only for 3 or less. NO AWARD OR PRIZES WILL BE HANDED OUT OVER THE WEEKEND. CLASS RESULTS WILL BE PUBLISHED ON THE CLUBS WEB SITE www.gemsc.com.au AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER THE EVENT. Certificates will be emailed to all place getters if you supply a clearly written valid email address on your entry form.**

11. **RACE FORMAT** Final race format will be based on entries received and will be decided after close of entries. The split of events between Saturday and Sunday (i.e. number of events each day) will be decided approx 2 weeks before the race meeting but will still be at the discretion of the **Clerk of the Course**.

12. MACHINES AND RIDERS

12.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Road Racing & **Historic Road Racing**.

12.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

12.3 Change of machine or rider is permitted up to 30 minutes prior to an event. Details of change must be submitted to the **Clerk of Course**.

12.4 Helmets are mandatory. All persons including officials using any bike, trike or quad at an event must be wearing a properly secured helmet at all times. **This includes while push starting any solos or sidecar.**

13. RIDING NUMBERS

13.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their preferred riding number. No double up of race numbers in any one race will be allowed.

13.2 All number plates on all machines **MUST** comply with the GCRs.

14. GRID POSITIONS

Grid positions for Saturdays events will be determined by Saturday morning practice times & Sundays events will be determined by Sunday morning practice times. Grid positions will not be progressive. If you miss your correct practice session you will have to start from the back of the grid for the remainder of the day. A grid limit of 20 will apply to all events as per the 2015 track license.

15. RIDERS BRIEFING

A riders briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing on both days and **ALL Competitors MUST attend**. Any riders failing to attend the riders briefing may be excluded from the event. Riders Briefing is a NON Smoking Area.

16. DRUG AND/OR ALCOHOL TESTING

16.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.

16.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the presentation of awards may be delayed at Motorcycling Queensland's discretion until the results of the tests are known.

17. CODE OF CONDUCT

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law – CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCRs) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this meeting and will be enforced.

18. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Carnell Raceway is approximately 1 km in length. Its surface is constructed of hot mix bitumen. Racing will be conducted in a clockwise direction. Push starting of machines in pit lane will only be allowed in a southerly direction towards the entry gate.

For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 8am Saturday 25th July with the completion of the meeting for the participant being after the last race on Sunday 26th July.

20. STARTS

The raising of the National Flag will start events. All starts will be clutch starts.

21. RACING

PRACTICE: Practice/qualifying sessions for each class will be held on Saturday & Sunday morning only.

22. NOISE

ALL MACHINES MUST COMPLY WITH A 95dba RIDE BY TEST AT 30M FROM THE SIDE OF THE TRACK (2015 MANUAL MOTORCYCLE SPORT RULES 13.14.1.1) MACHINES MEASURED OVER 95dba WILL BE UNABLE TO COMPETE UNTIL THE NOISE IS REDUCED TO THE ACCEPTED LEVEL.

23. GST N/A

24. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS

- 24.1 Final instructions will be emailed approximately 1 week before the event to everyone that supplies a clearly written & valid email address on their entry form.
- 24.2 Protective Clothing shall be worn as per GCRs 14.8
- 24.3 Scrutineering will take place in the dummy grid area
- 24.4 **HISTORIC LOG BOOKS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL HISTORIC MACHINES.**
- 24.5 Protests will be lodged as per 2015 Manual of Motorcycle Sport Section 7
- 24.6 FUEL: is not available at the track.
- 24.7 ALCOHOL IS NOT PERMITTED WITHIN THE PIT AREA DURING COMPETITION HOURS.
RIDERS CONTRAVENING THIS RULE WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE DAY'S EVENTS.
- 24.8 CHILDREN ON WHEELED DEVICES OF ANY KIND ARE NOT PERMITTED IN PIT LANE. These devices will be confiscated and returned at close of racing. CHILDREN UNDER 16 YEARS OF AGE ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE DUMMY GRID AREA.
- 24.9 **NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED WITHIN THE CIRCUIT GROUNDS AT ANY TIME.**
- 24.10 The promoter recommends that all competitors have a suitable fire extinguisher.
- 24.11 Any last minute changes to the classes of competition will be announced at riders briefing and are dependant on entries received for each class.
- 24.13 ALL NOVICE OR FIRST TIME RACERS ARE REQUIRED TO BRING A WHITE T-SHIRT TO WEAR OVER THEIR LEATHERS TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR FASTER RIDERS TO IDENTIFY YOU.
- 24.14 **Entry acceptance letters will NOT be sent out prior to this event. Nominations will be posted on the website www.gemsc.com.au in early July or they can be checked by contacting race secretary Rex Dell at treasurer@gemsc.com.au**
- 24.15 Entrants with duplicate numbers in the same event will be informed by phone or email prior to the event if they need to change their number (first entry received will be given their preferred number).
- 24.16 **We now have a return to full camping for both Friday & Saturdays nights. Gates will open at 3pm on Friday afternoon & 7am on Saturday & Sunday mornings. A strict 9pm noise curfew will apply for both nights & anyone found to be in breach of that curfew may be ejected from the facility . Rubbish bins are not be used for fires & all fires should be contained. Please contact event organizer David Vincent 0412 727929 webmaster@gemsc.com.au for more details.**
- 24.17 **The canteen will be open for lunch on Saturday & breakfast & lunch on Sunday.**
- 24.18 Carnell Raceway address is Rifle Range Rd, Stanthorpe Qld.
- 24.19 DIRECTIONS TO TRACK: Drive through town and take first left after bridge (blue sign to refuse tip). Take second right which is Rifle range Rd. Drive down Rifle Range Rd for about one kilometre until you see a yellow sign on the right for Carnell Raceway.

REGULARITY EVENT

- 1: The event is open to anyone who owns any capacity motorcycle, road registered or not, manufactured up to December 1990. All machines must be scrutineered prior to competition.
- 2: Machines must have mirrors removed or taped, headlights & indicators taped & side stands secured. Road registered machines must have the number plates removed.
- 3: Entrants will be split into fast & slow groups after Saturday mornings timing session. Both groups however are limited to a minimum lap time of 45 seconds.
- 4: Entrants in Regularity slow are encouraged to wear full race protection but must wear a minimum of draggin jeans or similar, jacket, boots, gloves & an approved helmet in good condition. No passing in corners!!!!.
- 5: Entrants in Regularity fast must wear full race protection as per the MOMS.
- 6: Machines "do not" require a race number as each machine will be fitted with a timing transmitter to record all lap times. No other form of timing may be carried on the machine & the speedo & tacho must be covered.
- 7: Entry fee is **\$90** per rider. **Each competitor will be issued with a "Single Use Recreational Activity License" (\$25 is included in the \$90 entry fee) unless you have a Senior MA license or have purchased a one day license for this event.**
- 8: Machines used in this event **cannot** be entered in a race event at the **same meeting by the same rider. Only one "spare" machine can be nominated per rider. Only one transponder will be allocated per rider.**
- 9: **The field is limited to a maximum of 40 which will be split into fast & slow groups on Saturday morning.**

For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnitees.

5. INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS

IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:

- a) I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them in the following manner:
 - i) that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
 - ii) that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
 - iii) that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- b) I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
- c) The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
- d) A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

6. MEDICAL

I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnitees will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate. I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

7. PRIVACY

I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by Event Organiser, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

8. PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below:

 - ii) MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and

facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
 iii) It is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).

- b) IN CONSIDERATION of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
 - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;

9. POLICIES AND REGULATIONS

- a) I acknowledge, understand and agree that it is a condition of my participation in the Event that I agree to be bound by, and subject to, the rules, regulations and jurisdiction of MA as amended from time to time. Copies of all MA rules, policies and regulations are available by contacting the MA office.
- b) All participants are bound by the MA anti doping policy and thus understand they may be subject to drug testing. Testing conducted by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is in accordance with the ASADA Act and the National Anti-Doping Scheme. Any participant infringing MA's policy or refusing a drug test may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the terms of the anti-doping policy.

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
