1. **ANNOUNCEMENT**
The Queensland Early Motorcycle Sports Club Incorporated, hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct the QEMSC Interclub Race Meeting at Carnell Raceway, Stanthorpe, Qld on Saturday and Sunday **23–24th July 2011**. For classes of competition please see section 6 below.
2. **JURISDICTION**
 - 2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Queensland who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number 40151 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Senior Club, Senior National & One Meeting Licences. **One meeting** licences will be sold on the day. Participants must be full financial members of QEMSC, Motorcycle Sportsmen or North Coast Road Racers.
 - 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport General Competition Rules (GCRs), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by Motorcycling Queensland.
BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.
3. **ENTRIES**
 - 3.1 Entries open forthwith and close last mail **Friday 8th July 2011**.
 - 3.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the promoter, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling Queensland.
 - 3.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
 - 3.4 **RETURN OF ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING WILL BE CONSIDERED ONLY IF NOTIFICATION IS GIVEN AT LEAST ONE WEEK PRIOR TO THE RACE DAY.**
 - 3.5 **ENTRY LISTS WILL BE LOADED ON THE WEB SITE STARTING APPROX 4 WEEKS FROM RACE DAY**
 - 3.5 **ALL ENTRIES TO BE POSTED TO THE CLUB TREASURER:**

4. **ENTRY FEE**
 - 4.1 An entry fee of \$150.00 will be charged for all solo and sidecar competitors. If required, one meeting licences are available on the day at a cost of \$44.00. Full payment **MUST** accompany the entry form.
LATE ENTRIES MAY BE ACCEPTED SUBJECT TO A LATE PAYMENT FEE OF \$50.
 - 4.2 Payment by cheque or money order only. **ANY FEES FOR DISHONOURED CHEQUES WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT. DO NOT SEND CASH THROUGH THE MAIL.** Cheques and money orders are to be made payable to QEMSC.
5. **ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS**
Classes of competition will be decided on the day of the event and are dependent on entries received for that class. Any decision to run a class, or to combine classes, will be at the discretion of the promoter, subject to the approval of the **RACE STEWARD**.

6. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

Class 1 # Historic sidecars – Period 3/4/5

Class 2 # Historic Period 2 – Pre 1946 solos up to 1300cc,

Class 3 # Historic Period 3 – Pre 1963 solos up to 1300cc

Class 4 # Historic Period 4 – 1963 to 1972 solos up to 500cc four stroke multis and 650 cc twins (track licence limitation)

Class 5 # Historic Period 5 – 1972 to 1982 solos up 350cc two stroke, 500cc four stroke multis, 650cc twins and 1000cc singles

Class 6 # Historic Period 6 -- 1983 to 1990 (as per Period 5)

NOTE - All historic entries must have a current log book

Class 7 #Modern Sidecars – Formula 1&2

Class 8 #Superlites & Motolites (as per GCR's & NCRR specifications)

Class 9 #Supermoto - As per Section 24 of 2010 Manual of Motorcycle Sport

Class 10 #Superbike Lites (400 cc multis as per GCR's)

Class 11 #Clubsport Lites (250cc multis)

Class 12 #Formula Stanthorpe (over 200cc, up to 400 multis, 650cc twins & 1000cc singles)

Class 13 #GP125

NOTE 1: Classes 10-13 will be run as one "combined" event with individual points scoring for each class.

NOTE 2: Competitors who request the same machine be able to compete in more than 1 class will be entered in their preferred class & will only be able to compete in a second class if numbers permit. Historic competitors will be entered in their historic class as their preferred class.

Class 14 #Regularity (see Regularity info on QEMSC web site)

7. INSURANCE

7.1 MA's National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability only.

7.2 **IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.**

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

An ambulance will be in attendance between 11:30 am–4:30 pm on Saturday and 10 am–2.30 pm Sunday.

9. **AWARDS: NO AWARD OR PRIZES WILL BE HANDED OUT OVER THE WEEKEND. CLASS RESULTS WILL BE PUBLISHED ON THE CLUBS WEB SITE www.qemsc.com.au AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER THE EVENT**

11. RACE FORMAT

Final race format will be based on entries received and will be decided after close of entries. The split of events between Saturday and Sunday (i.e. number of events each day) will be decided at the race meeting and will be at the discretion of the **Clerk of the Course**.

12. MACHINES AND RIDERS

12.1 All historic machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for **Historic Road Race Competition**.

12.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

12.3 Change of machine or rider is permitted up to 30 minutes prior to an event. Details of change must be submitted to the **Clerk of Course**.

12.4 Helmets are mandatory. All persons including officials using any bike, trike or quad at an event must be wearing a properly secured helmet.

13. RIDING NUMBERS

13.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their preferred riding number.

For competitors in the "combined" event riders numbers will be allocated on a first entry basis.

No double up of race numbers will be allowed in this or any other event.

13.2 All number plates on all machines **MUST** comply with the GCRs.

14. GRID POSITIONS

Grid positions for Saturday will be determined by Saturday morning practice lap times,

Sunday grid positions will be determined by Sundays practice lap times.

RIDERS WILL BE EXPECTED TO SELECT THE CORRECT GRID POSITION AND BE READY TO RACE WITHOUT DELAY.

NOTE: For Superlite/Motolite competitors the above applies but your grid positions will also be progressive over the weekend, ie Revised grid positions will be posted after every event for the following event.

A grid limit of 20 will apply to all events except for Superlite/Motolite which will be allowed 24 as per the 2011 track license.

15. RIDERS BRIEFING

A riders briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing on both days and **ALL Competitors MUST attend**. All riders attending the briefing shall sign the sign on sheet. Any riders failing to attend riders briefing or signing the attendance sheet may be excluded from the event. Riders Briefing is a NON Smoking Area.

16. DRUG AND/OR ALCOHOL TESTING

16.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.

16.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the presentation of awards may be delayed at Motorcycling Queensland's discretion until the results of the tests are known.

17. CODE OF CONDUCT

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law – CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCRs) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this meeting and will be enforced.

18. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Carnell Raceway is approximately 1 km in length. Its surface is constructed of hot mix bitumen. Racing will be conducted in a clockwise direction.

Lights will start all events. If the lights malfunction, the raising of the National Flag will start events. All starts will be clutch starts.

21. RACING

PRACTICE: Practice sessions for each class will be at the start of each day.

22. NOISE

ALL MACHINES MUST COMPLY WITH A 102dba STATIC TEST AND THE **2011** MANUAL OF MOTORCYCLE SPORT RULES 12.10.1.1. MACHINES MEASURED OVER 102dba MAY BE UNABLE TO COMPETE UNTIL THE NOISE IS REDUCED TO THE ACCEPTED LEVEL. **NOTE: THE CLUB WILL BE CONDUCTING NOISE TESTING ON ALL MACHINES AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CLERK OF THE COURSE.**

24. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS

24.1 NA

24.2 Protective Clothing shall be worn as per GCRs 15.1.

24.3 Scrutineering will be located in pit lane.

24.4 HISTORIC LOG BOOKS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL HISTORIC MACHINES.

(Pre 1990 machines without log books that are within the track limitations may compete in Formula Stanthorpe).

24.5 Protests will be lodged as per **2011** Manual of Motorcycle Sport Rule 5.1.

24.6 FUEL: is not available at the track.

24.7 ALCOHOL IS NOT PERMITTED WITHIN THE PIT AREA DURING COMPETITION HOURS.

RIDERS CONTRAVENING THIS RULE WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE DAY'S EVENTS.

24.8 CHILDREN ON WHEELED DEVICES OF ANY KIND ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE PIT AREA. These devices will be confiscated and returned at close of racing. CHILDREN UNDER 16 YEARS OF AGE ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE PIT LANE.

24.9 NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED WITHIN THE CIRCUIT GROUNDS AT ANY TIME.

24.10 The promoter recommends that all competitors have a suitable fire extinguisher.

ANY CLUB MEMBERS NOT COMPETING ARE URGED TO BRING A FIRE EXTINGUISHER FOR THE FLAG POINTS.

24.11 Classes of competition will be announced at riders briefing and are dependant on entries received for each class.

24.12 NA.

24.13 ALL NOVICE OR FIRST TIME RACERS ARE REQUIRED TO BRING A WHITE T-SHIRT TO WEAR OVER THEIR LEATHERS TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR FASTER RIDERS TO IDENTIFY YOU.

24.14 **Entry acceptance letters will NOT be sent out prior to this event. DO NOT SEND A SELF ADDRESSED ENVELOPE WITH YOUR ENTRY. Nominations will be posted on the website www.qemsc.com.au in early July or they can be checked by phoning club treasurer Glynn Leitch on 0412 401436**

24.15 Entrants with duplicate numbers in the same event will be informed by phone prior to the event if they need to change their number (first entry received will be given their preferred number).

24.16 Camping at the track will be permitted on Friday & Saturday nights.

24.17 **The canteen will be open for lunch on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday.**

24.18 Carnell Raceway address is Rifle Range Rd, Stanthorpe Qld.

CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE QEMSC INTERCLUB MEETING

WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below): [Insert Name]

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

2. DEFINITIONS In this declaration:

- a) "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
- b) "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
- c) "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
- d) "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
- e) "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
- f) "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - i) that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - ii) that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - iii) that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - iv) that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - v) that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - vi) that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - vii) that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - viii) that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- b) the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- c) to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- d) have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport: and

- ii) It is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).
- b) IN CONSIDERATION of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
 - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;
 - ii) may use any information collected in accordance with this clause for any purpose consistent with creating safer competition in motorcycle sport and events held by or in conjunction with MA, my SCB, or with an MA or SCB permit;
 - iii) may disclose my Information to third parties provided such disclosure is reasonably intended to be used for the purpose of improving safety at events held by or in conjunction with MA, or with an MA permit provided any such information is held by MA or my SCB in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- c) I irrevocably authorise MA and my SCB and hereby appoint MA and my SCB as my lawful attorneys to collect from my Carers, and I hereby direct my Carers to provide to MA or my SCB upon request being made by MA or my SCB, any of my Information including but not limited to any information concerning any incident or event causing or contributing to or resulting from any injury, illness or death to me, the details of any diagnosis and prognosis provided to me by my Carers (or any party with the knowledge of any of my Carers), and any other matter to the knowledge of my Carers that might reasonably be considered to be requested by MA or my SCB for the purpose of improving safety at MA and SCB events.

9. POLICIES AND REGULATIONS

- a) I acknowledge, understand and agree that it is a condition of my participation in the Event that I agree to be bound by, and subject to, the rules, regulations and jurisdiction of MA as amended from time to time. Copies of all MA rules, policies and regulations are available by contacting the MA office.
- b) All participants are bound by the MA anti doping policy and thus understand they may be subject to drug testing. Testing conducted by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is in accordance with the ASADA Act and the National Anti-Doping Scheme. This involves the taking of a sample (any human biological fluid or tissue whether alive or otherwise, or any human breath) for the purpose of detecting the use of a Prohibited Drug or Doping Method. Any participant infringing MA's policy or refusing a drug test may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the terms of the anti-doping policy.
