#### 12.11 ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Road Racing Assoc of Townsville, hereafter and jointly called the PROMOTING CLUB will conduct a zone ROAD RACING meeting for Juniors and Seniors at the Suncity Raceway, Shaw Rd, Bohle, as per Permit 51033.

## 2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1 The abovementioned Zone meeting has been authorised by MQ who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number 51033, and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National, Club, Junior and One Meeting
- 2.2 The meeting will incorporate the Townsville Tourist Trophy for all classes listed in Section 8 Classes of Competition, qualifying for eligible classes of the QLD RR Championship and the Weldsure One Hour Road Race Challenge, Sponsor TBA QRR Moto One Hour Challenge and Sponsor TBA 3/4 Hour Junior / Senior Challenge conducted under permit 51033 and in accordance with the Supplementary Regulations for that series.
- 2.3 One Meeting Licences will NOT be issued to junior competitors unless they can provide a current JCP Log Book.
- 2.4 The meeting is to be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport (GCR'S) as issued by Motorcyling Australia, these supplementary regulations, the by-laws of MQ and any final instructions.
- 2.5 BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, **BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.**

#### **ENTRIES:**

- 3.1 Entries open forthwith, AND CLOSE last mail 8th August 2011. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE RELEVANT NOMINATION FEE. No entries will be accepted on the day of the meeting.
- 3.2 PERSONAL SPONSOR'S DETAILS MUST BE ADVISED WITH ENTRY IF THEIR INCLUSION IN THE EVENT PROGRAM IS REQUIRED. AT LEAST 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE CLOSING DATE.
- 3.3 Late entries may be accepted in the case of a new member at the discretion of the Race Secretary however these entries will incur a late fee of \$ 20.00.
- 3.4 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Club or transferred to a future round, if such retention or transfer is approved by MQ.
- 3.5 Only entries received on the official Entry Form will be accepted.
- 3.6 Any refund of entry fees for any rider withdrawing from the event shall be at the discretion of the promoter.

#### **ENTRY FEES**

- 4.1 \$110.00 for all Senior Classes.
- 4.2 \$80.00 Juniors .
- 4.3 Entry Fees include a mandatory \$5.00 transponder hire fee.
- 4.4 Entry for second and subsequent classes with the exception of the One Hour, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Hour Challenges by the same competitor is \$20.00.
- 4.5 Å practice/ track day will be held on Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> August 2011. Practice / track day will be \$55.00 if participating in the TT or Challenge events, \$110.00 practice /track day only, details will be on www.rrat.com.au
- 4.6 **ONE HOUR CHALLENGES \$40.00** per single rider competing for 1 hour, **\$20.00** per rider **provided that both riders have nominated in other events at this meeting.** Teams not competing in other events, nomination shall be **\$65.00** per rider per machine single or team entry.
- 4.7 ¾ HOUR JUNIOR / SENIOR CHALLENGE, \$10.00 per Junior and \$10.00 per Senior
- 4.8 Payment by cheque or money order only. Any fees for dishonoured cheques will be the responsibility of the entrant. DO NOT SEND CASH IN THE MAIL.
- 4.9 Cheques and Money Orders are to be made payable to the R.R.A.T.
- 4.10 No further discounts are available for the CHALLENGE events.

#### 5. INSURANCE:

- 5.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 5.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.
- 5.3 IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.

#### 6. MEDICAL SERVICES:

6.1 Queensland Ambulance Service will be in attendance during the practice and racing portion of the meeting.

#### 7. ENTRY PASSES:

7.1 Competitors free entry for both days.

#### 8. TOURIST TROPHY CLASSES OF COMPETITION:

#### \* Classes QRR Moto

a. Class A-: Open

b. Class B-: up to 250cc

c. S9 Junior motard Div 1 and 2.

#### \* Classes Road Race.

- **a.** Class A-: Air cooled only, 125cc up to 159cc four stroke, up to 111cc 2 stroke air cooled single cylinders. Clubman and Open classes to be determined by qualifying times.
- **b.** Class B-: 125cc up to 250cc four stroke any configuration (no Gp125's or 250 Mono's), 80cc 2 stroke up to and including 125cc (no GP bikes)
- c. Class C-: 251cc up 650cc twin cyclinders and 1000cc Mono's, 125cc 2 stroke (GP and 250 Mono's ALLOWED) as per current track license.
- d. Class D-: Junior road race
- e. Historic

#### **AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:**

- 10.1 Competitors who have nominated for the Challenge Events shall be competing for trophies as detailed in the relevant rules at www.rrat.com.au
- 10.2 Trophies will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, in all T.T classes of competition.
- 10.3 Medallions will be awarded to all qualifying TT entrants.
- 10.4 The Neil Fagerstrom Perpetual trophy shall be awarded to the competitor adjudged by the key officials who has made the most significant contribution to the event.

#### 11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 11.1 To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be four.
- 11.2 Any race that has less than 4 remaining competitors may be combined with another class.
- 11.3 Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine event, will be at the discretion of the promoter, subject to Motorcycling Queensland approval.

#### 12. FORMAT:

- 12.12 TOURIST TROPHY and QLD qualifying Rounds.
- **12.13** Timed Qualifying Sessions will take place on Sunday. Non qualifiers may start from rear of the grid at discretion of the Clerk of Course.
- **12.14** Sprint races Sunday will consist of four heats of 6 laps minimum.
- **12.15** All machines shall have 2 warm-up laps.
- **12.16** The number of laps may be altered at the discretion of the Clerk of Course/Steward.
- **12.17** All starts for the TT classes will be by Clutch from a standing position.
- **12.18** See point 19 for a I provisional timetable & race format. Time table will be published in final instructions.

#### 13. CHALLENGE EVENTS.

13.1 Challenge Events will consist of a single 1 Hour race for seniors and a Single ¾ hour race for juniors/seniors.

#### WELDSURE 1 hour challenge.

#### **Classes Road Race:**

Class A. Air cooled only, 125cc up to 159cc four strokes, up to 111cc 2 stroke air cooled single cylinders.

Clubman and open classes: Classes to be determined by qualifying times.

Class B. 125cc up to 250cc four stroke any configuration (no GP bikes or monos), 80cc 2 stroke up to and including 125cc (no GP bikes).

Class C. 251cc up to Track licence for 4 stroke, 125cc 2 stroke up to track license. (GP bikes allowed.)

Class D. Historic's all classes combined.

**Class RR.** Ironman-: combined classes, compete for 1 hour, most laps completed regardless of machine.

This event is open to all machines complying with the current MOMS and as per RRAT rules.

This event is closed to junior competitors. (Unless they have a suitably endorsed licence, competing on a GP125 or 250 monos in the appropriate class).

The event will be divided into 2 Categories.

- a. Class RR-: Single rider competing for 1 hour.
- b. Classes A,B,C and D-: will be teams event only
- c. This race will be limited to 24 grid positions, nominate early to be assured of a position. Only paid nominations will be given consideration.

- 3. <u>All teams</u> shall consist of two riders, one of whom must compete in the event for a **minimum of 15 Minutes**, on one machine. Failure of one rider to complete a minimum of 15 minutes shall result in disqualification of the team. This will be monitored by the electronic timing system. In the event of a competitor being injured during the One Hour Event, rendering him unable to continue, the remaining rider may complete any remaining portion of the race.
- 4. Teams, riders must be drawn from another class-: EG, two superlite riders competing as a team in class A will incur a 10 lap penalty.
- 5. A substitute or spare machine may not be entered in this event.
- 6. A rider may only enter in one team or as a single rider, per event.
- 7. Each Rider in a team must wear an identification number on the left hand side of their helmet, in a colour that contrasts with their helmet colour, and be not less than 100 mm in height.
- 8. The team's first rider to compete in the race shall have the number 1 on their helmet; the second rider shall have the number 2 on their helmet.
- Qualifying will be one 5 minute session. Any team member may qualify. A single rider must qualify his own machine.
- 10. Grid positions will be determined from this session from 1 through 24.
- 11. Start will be "Lemans Style" start. The first rider of each team shall be on the infield side of the track. The second rider in each team shall have the machine started on the outfield side of the track. The machine MUST be started, and the gearbox MUST BE IN NEUTRAL. The rider holding the machine may "blip" the throttle; however he may not touch the clutch lever. When the starter lowers the Australian flag the lead rider of each time is to sprint across the track and mount the machine. In the case of a one man team assistance will be provided by the hosting club.
- 12. Under no circumstance is the second rider to enter the track surface, or assist with pushing a stalled machine.
- 13. The event shall be a timed competition of 60 minutes duration, plus one lap. The start of the competition shall be deemed as when the starter lowers the Australian flag, and will declared finished at the expiration of one hour, plus one lap .The chequered flag will be shown to ALL competitors to inform them that the race has finished.Recieving the chequered flag does not mean you have won.
- 14. Rider Change This shall be performed in an area designated in pit lane.
- 15. Overtaking when entering or leaving the designated change over area in pit lane shall result in TWO LAPS BEING DEDUCTED FROM THEIR TEAM'S FINAL LAP TALLY.
- Riders shall only use first gear whilst in pit lane. RIDERS JUDGED TO BE IN BREACH OF
   THIS RULE SHALL HAVE TWO LAPS DEDUCTED FROM THEIR TEAM'S FINAL LAP TALLY.
  - 17. Refuelling during the race is NOT PERMITTED.
  - 18. If a machine stops in pit lane it MAY be moved to a designated repair area AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CHIEF MARSHAL. The team may only rejoin the competition with the permission of the Clerk of the Course.
  - 19. The One Hour shall be run for 60 minutes plus one lap. If an incident occurs that requires intervention a White board with the letters PB in black shall be displayed at the chief flag marshal point. A pace bike shall enter the circuit at the direction of the Clerk of Course and all competitors are to slow down and stay behind the pace bike until:
  - (a) Such time that the Clerk of Course has determined that it is appropriate for racing to resume and;
  - (b) The pace bike has left the circuit and;
  - (c) THE COMPETITOR HAS PASSED THE GREEN FLAG WAVED AT THE START LINE.
  - (d) ANY COMPETITOR OBSERVED OVERTAKING UNDER THESE CONDITIONS SHALL HAVE TWO LAPS DEDUCTED FROM THEIR TEAM'S LAP TALLY.
  - 20. If the Clerk Of Course determines that the race must be stopped and / or declared a red flag shall be displayed.
  - 21. The team who has both completed the most laps and is leading the last lap at the expiry of one hour or the declared finish of the competition shall be declared the outright winner.
  - 22. The bike/ team that has completed the most laps and is leading that class in the last lap at the expiry of one hour plus 1 lap or the declared finish of the competition shall be declared the

- overall winner. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place getters per class shall be determined in the same manner.
- 23. The first rider to be shown the chequered flag may not necessarily be the winning team.
- 24. The determination of the winning / place-getting teams shall be based on the results recorded by the lap scorers and collated and declared by the designated timekeeper.
- 25. The announcement of the final positions will be made during the presentations at the close of competition.

## WELDSURE JUNIOR / SPONSOR 45 MINUTE RACE FORMAT:

- 1. A peg draw will determine the start grid for the 45 min event.
- 2. The junior rider will ride the first 25 minutes of the even, at which time a last lap board will be displayed to all junior riders. They will return to the dummy grid where the sponsor will take over the bike. When all junior riders are off the track & out of the dummy grid area the pit marshal will direct all bikes back onto the track in the order they came off the track, behind a pace bike when the pace bike leaves the circuit you are remain in those positions until you have passed the start line when racing resumes with the sponsor on board to complete the remaining 20 minutes of the race.
- Sponsors must hold a current Competition Licence, or a One Event Licence, to be eligible to participate in this event.
  - a. Trophies will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> teams for this event, based on overall finishing position at 45 minutes.

Any protest will be dealt with as per the current MOMS

#### 14. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 14.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Road Race Competition.
- 14.2 Formula Road Race machines are permitted in addition to the GCR's to use slick tyres.
- 14.3 All motorcycles must be fitted with folding or "shear" type footrests.
- 14.4 Engine crankcase and gearbox breathers must be fitted with hoses feeding into an oil catch container with a volume of at least 300cc, which must be emptied after each event (local track requirement)
- 14.5 Carburettor and radiator vent and overflow hoses should be fed into:
  A suitable catch tank, or a catch tray for non-ADR and fully faired machines as per the GCR's.
- 14.6 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- 14.7 Each rider must present their leathers, helmet, back protector, eye protection, gloves, boots and licence to the Machine Examiner, at the SAME time as the machine(s) to be examined.
- 14.8 New riders to road racing will be required to wear a white T-shirt over their leathers.
- 14.9 Any competitor involved in an accident must represent their machine and full riding gear to the Machine Examiner/ Scrutineer for an inspection and clearance before continuing with the day's racing.
- 14.10 Late arrivals to scrutineering MAY be considered at the discretion of the Race Secretary and/or Clerk of the Course. This may entail a delay in Track access.
- 14.11 A substitute machine may be permitted if submitted to the Clerk of the Course and with the approval of the Steward at least ten minutes prior to the start of the race in which the substitution is requested. Substitute machines must have passed machine examination, be eligible for the class and replace a machine that cannot be reasonably repaired.
- 14.12 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Registered Riding Number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Club's discretion.
- 14.13 Motolite/Superlite classes must display their riding numbers with white lettering on a black background.
- 14.14 End case protection will be enforced at all RRAT events in 2011 as per GCR's.

#### **15.GRID POSITIONS:**

- 15.1 Grid positions will be determined by a qualifying, or at the discretion of the promoter, for the first heat of each round, with the exception of the Challenge Events.
- 15.2 Grid positions for subsequent heats will be the finishing order from the previous heat.
- 15.3 Novice riders will be started from the rear of the field.

#### 16. RIDERS BRIEFINGS:

16.1 A Riders Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of practice and / or racing **on Sunday at 9.30 am**. <u>ALL</u> Competitors **MUST** attend this briefing. Late arrivals MAY receive a briefing **at the discretion of the COC**.

#### 17. DRUGS AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 17.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 17.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed at MQ discretion until the results of the tests are known.

#### 18. CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 18.1 All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCR's) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.
- **19.** Final instructions will be posted on www.rrat.com.au no later than the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2011 to include the time table.

#### 19. TIMETABLE:

19.1 Final time table will be published in final instructions no later than the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2011.

#### Riders briefing 9.30

**20.** For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the Saturday / Sunday portions of the meeting will be deemed to be 7.00 am with the completion on both days of the meeting for the participant being **half an hour** after they have participated in their last event on this day.

This includes if the participant has withdrawn from racing for any reason.

#### 21. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

21.1 Clockwise 950 metre asphalt Kart Track

#### 22. STARTS:

- 22.1 All starts for the **Townsville TT** will be by clutch operation from a standing position. Races will start by flag and / or lights. The light sequence shall be Red to GREEN .The signal to start is when the GREEN light is illuminated.
- 22.2 Refer to Challenge Event Rules at www.rrat.com.au for the Challenge event starting procedure.

#### 23. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 23.1 One Meeting Licences are available on the day for \$44.00 (GST included).
- 23.2 No dogs are allowed at the race circuit
- 23.3 **No alcohol or smoking** is permitted in the pit area or the pit paddock.
- 23.4 <u>All persons in the pit area must have closed in footwear. Riders are responsible for their crew members / friends / family etc.</u>
- 23.5 No bicycles, skateboards, roller skates etc. are allowed in the pit area
- 23.6 Food and Drinks will be available onsite
- 23.7 Children must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.
